

Instructions for Re-enactors

- As you are being treated as volunteers, you are expected to conduct yourself with the same decorum we require of our volunteers. This includes the Code of Conduct (signed by your unit/group lead).
- All vehicles must be in place no later than 700 a.m. on Saturday.
- Vehicles cannot depart the field before 3:30 p.m. each day.
- All unloading of vehicles and equipment must be done and vehicles in proper parking are no later than 7:00 a.m. each day.
- Any re-enactor that comes through the gate after 7:00 will be required to go through a bag check. If you are bringing in a weapon for display, please contact one of the following before approaching the gate:

- There will be a tent set up in the re-enactor field for weapons checks. All weapons must go through a weapons safety check. A safety officer (one of the above listed people) will visit each encampment to perform a weapons safety check.
- Any re-enactor displaying weapons in an unsafe manner will be given one warning and if the violation occurs again, will be asked to leave.
- Weapons should not be carried when walking around the ramp to view the show. If you are transitioning to an approved display area (e.g. C-53), weapons can be carried.
